



If you want to ensure a seat, the first floor restaurant will be taking bookings – but be quick, the boat race is an extremely popular event.



## WALKERS OF WHITEHALL

Situated at mile 25 of the race, celebrate those nearing the end of the marathon at Walkers of Whitehall. Be sure to try the 6 hour braised ox cheek with buttermilk and seasonal greens if it's not just a drink you're after.

Feeling guilty for not running the marathon yourself? Try a low calorie cocktail such as the apple spritz with Tanqueray gin, zesty apple juice and elderflower topped with mint for the ultimate refreshment.



## THE MAYFLOWER

Approaching the halfway point at mile 11 is The Mayflower. 

Diane Arbus was the original people-watcher. Some lads larking around by the coast, a glamorous receptionist at her desk, two women shooting evils at the universe; nothing escaped her notice. The Hayward Gallery's exhibition of photographs from the first seven years of her career (1956-1962) is sleekly arranged with each small print attached to one side of a tall white rectangle. The effect is like walking through a graveyard, a towering Arlington Cemetery dedicated to the memory of Arbus's native New York.

## Sorolla: Spanish Master of Light

Known as the 'master of light' for his iridescent canvases, this is a rare opportunity to see the most complete exhibition of Joaquín Sorolla y Bastida's (1863–1923) paintings outside Spain, in over a century. From the vivid seascapes, garden views, and bather scenes for which he is most renowned, to portraits, landscapes and genre scenes of Spanish life. The exhibition will feature 58 works spanning Sorolla's career — many of which are travelling from private collections and afar.



## Edvard Munch: 'Love and Angst'
