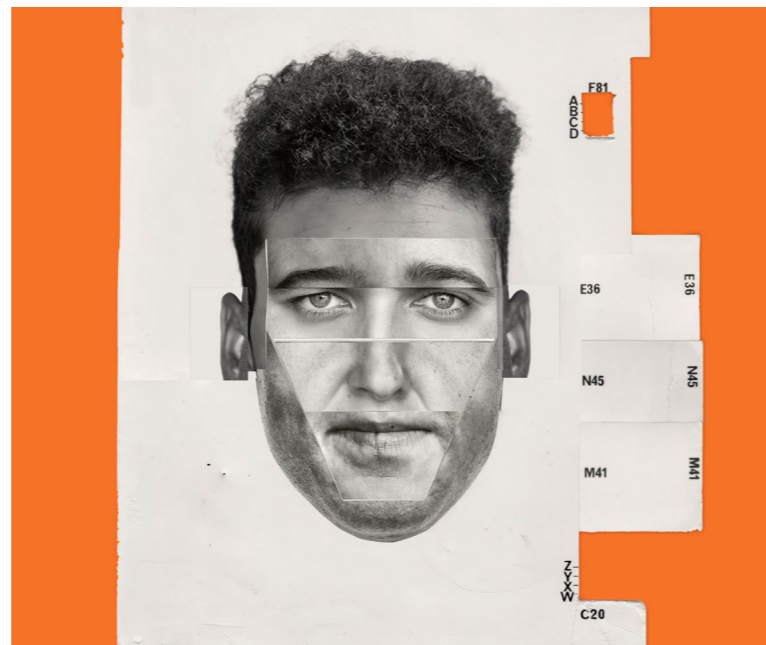

Dining in a Dash

As we return to work after a long summer of delicious lunches that drifted into the late hours of the afternoon, there's no need to worry about a soggy sandwich being wolfed down back at your desk. Many restaurants across the neighbourhood offer a speedy, set-menu for lunchtime diners and we've rounded up the best to book.

Rabbit

172 King's Road, London SW3 4UP

The Farm to Fork set menu, named one of the best 'meal deals' under £30 in London by Hot Dinners, is a perfect mid-week express offering. Start with cured trout with a dill emulsion and follow with a butternut squash ravioli for just £22. Add a dessert, a summery twist on Bread Pudding, for just £25. And when booking, ask for a seat by the window to soak up the buzz of the King's Road and enjoy some fantastic 'people watching'.



Colbert

50-52 Sloane Square, London SW1W 8AX

Colbert is one of the most stylish places to be spotted at lunchtime. A Prix-Fixe menu offers two or three course options for when time is of the essence (£24.75 or £29.95 respectively), with highlights including a celeriac remoulade to start, and a Souffle Suisse for mains. Light desserts are optional, including a seasonal sorbet or a duo of macarons. Service is known however, to be impressive so should you have time for something more leisurely, the A La Carte menu of bistro classics is worth a peek.





The LaLee

With the option of choose from two courses (£40) or three (£50), when you have a little more time on your hands, The LaLee has a set menu that will transport you back to the European café culture you enjoyed over summer. Starters are light and nutritious, a spring vegetable salad with pomegranate and feta for example, whilst a choice of three main courses, including a delicious roasted Cornish chicken with broad beans and wild garlic, with leave you energized for afternoon ahead. If you have time, and can squeeze it in, the pink grapefruit mousse with Cadogan honey ice cream makes a wonderful finale.



Le Petit Beefbar

Tucked away on a little Chelsea street near King's Road, Le Petit Beefbar gives Parisian brasserie vibe. The horsehoe bar and dim lights set the tone as soon as you step in, not to mention the yellow velvet curtain, art deco elements, wood-panelled walls, intimate tables for two and David Shrigley's modern artworks. As part of their set-menu, enjoy their Signature Steak Frites with a salad for just £29.



Elystan Street

For meetings that warrant something a little than the board room, the Michelin-starred Elystan Street oozes elegance in spades and has a set lunch menu to match (three courses for £39.50). Start with a fresh salad of finely sliced courgettes and ricotta, before one of the finest double-baked cheese souffles across the Capital. Light desserts such as a greengage and Mirabelle plum fool, or cheeses are also available.

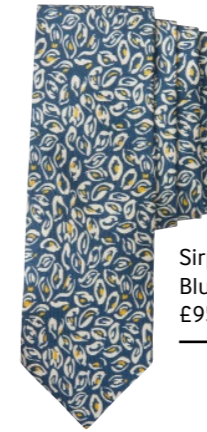

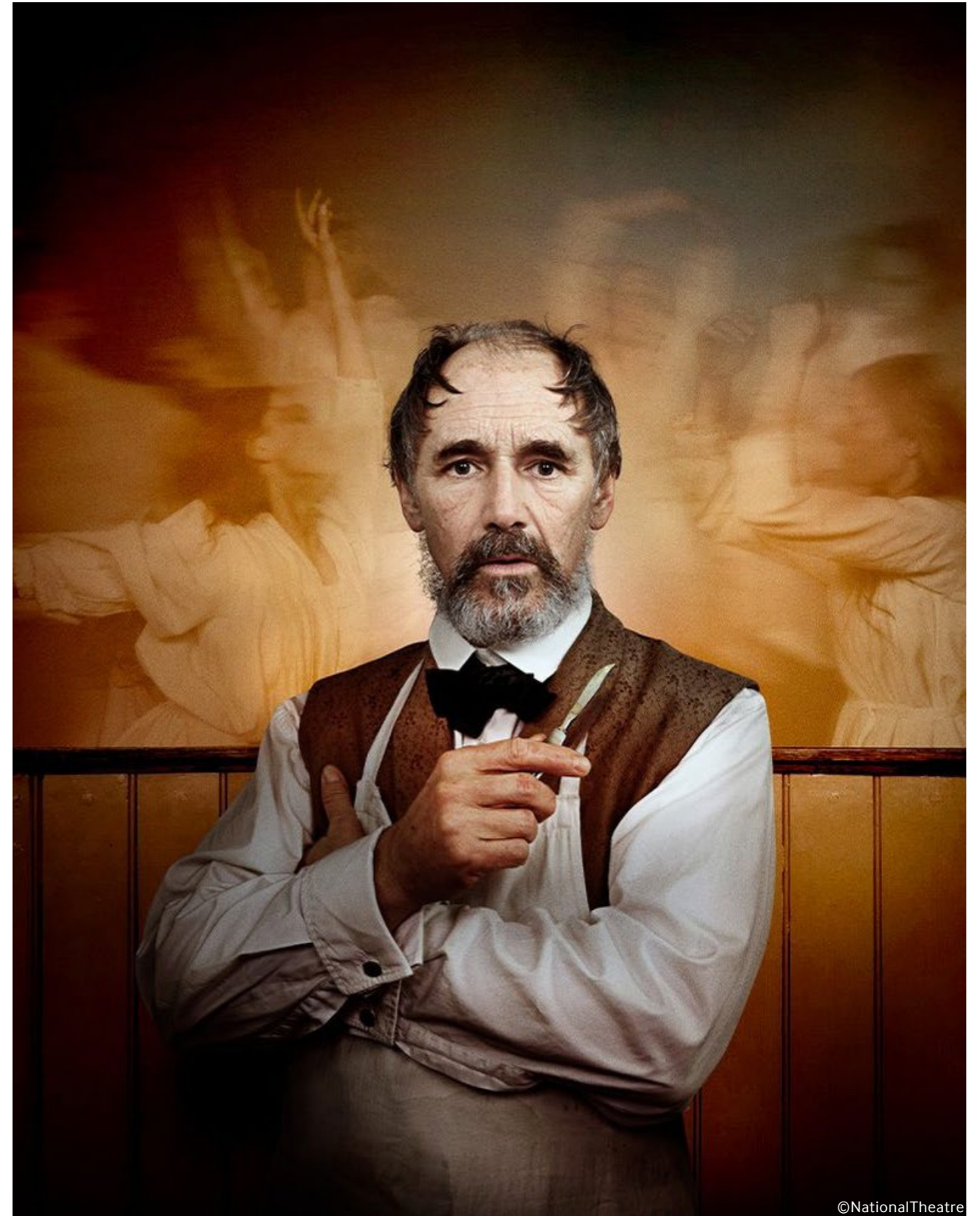

Busted: 20th Anniversary & Greatest Hits Tour

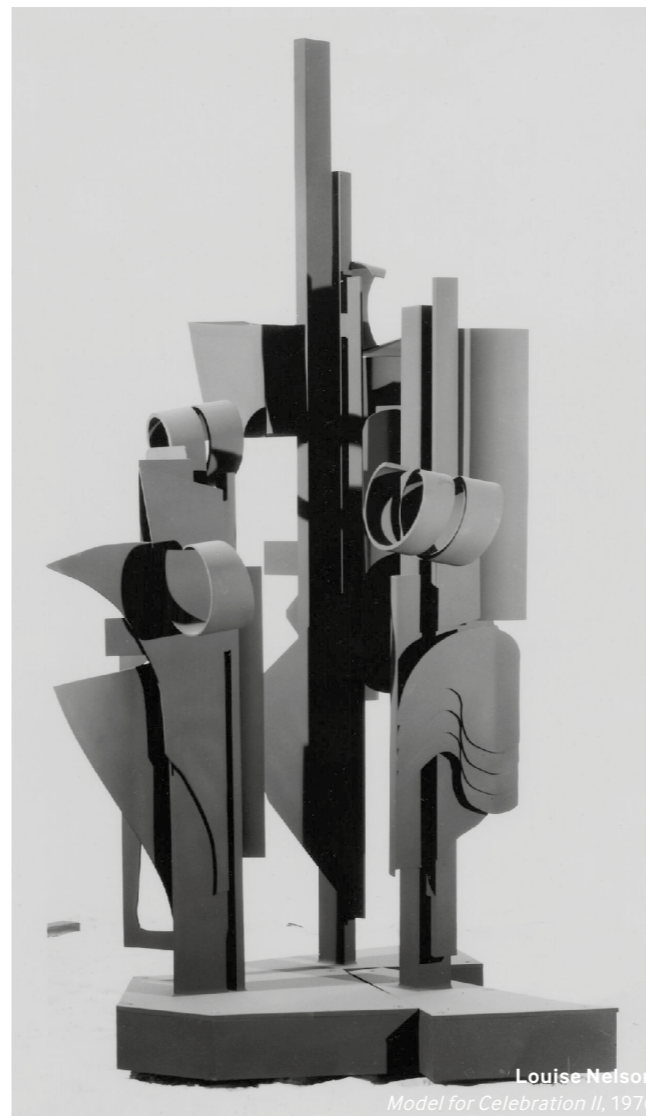
